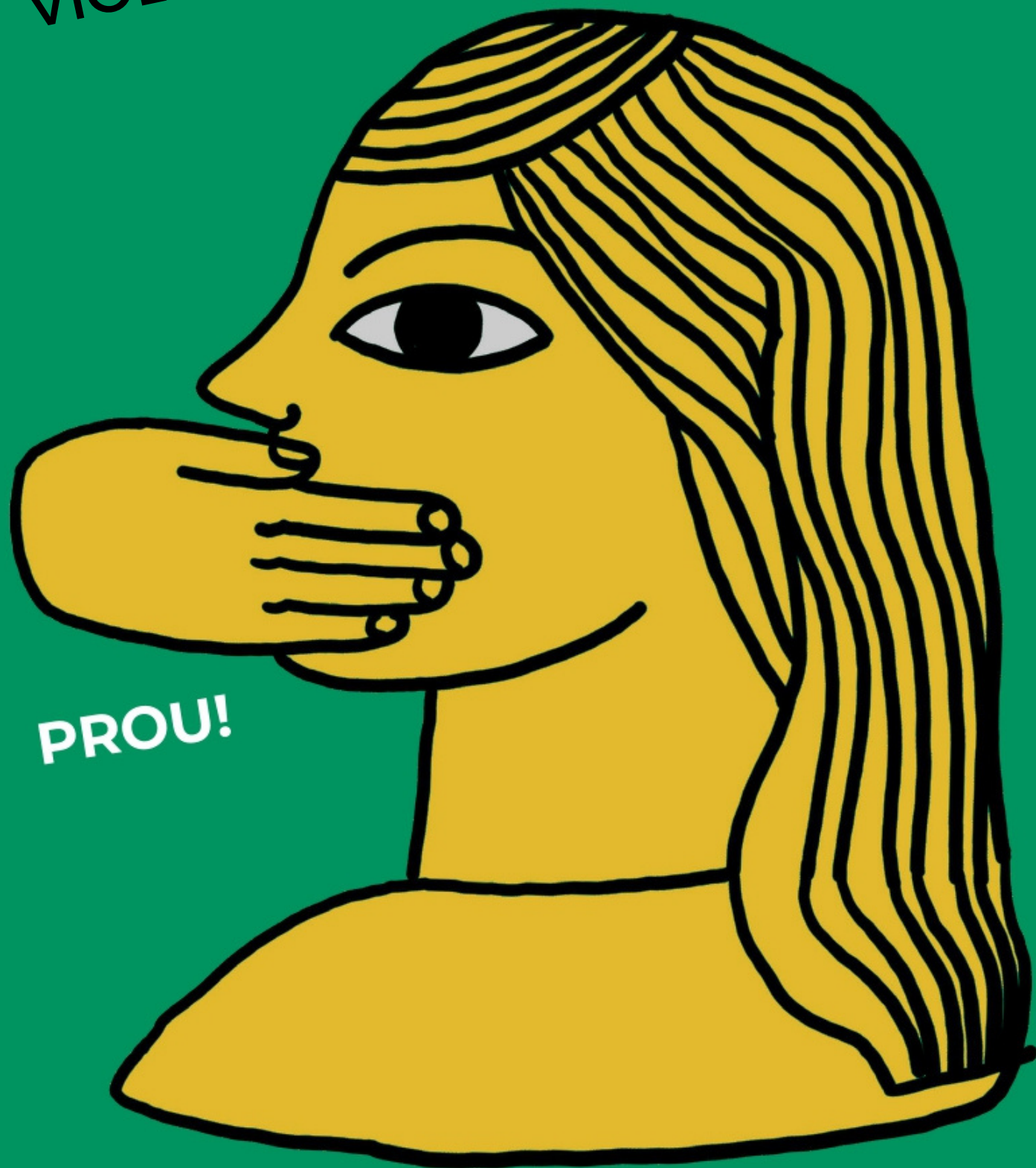

TIME OF HEALTH, SOCIAL AND HUMAN CRISIS

The ravages of the pandemic catapult the need for care, the essential resources for life, nature, politics, and public enterprises.

The coronavirus pandemic in the age of globalization is deadly to humanity, nature, the economic and political system, and surely to women, children, and men. The whole planet's economy is on the verge of collapse. In Spain, we are at 43.9% youth unemployment, there is a high increase in precariousness and poverty. Public health, with front-line workers, must make huge efforts to save lives and take on the casualties. Science, at full speed, is looking for a vaccine, after ten years of disregarding the warnings of the scientific community.

The feminist strike of 2018 cried out "if we, women, stop, the world stops". And women did stop. Now that the world has been stopped by a health crisis, result, not only of an inopportune virus, but by the great cuts that we have been denouncing for years, it has been shown more than ever that the cry of millions of women around the world is a reality.

Feminized professions, health, home, social work, cleaning, support groups, women turn out to be an overwhelming 80% of those who are largely engaged in the care, health and life of people and nature. The values of this sorority, commitment and love lead us to public resources, communal goods and universal rights.

We come from a structural deficit in social care policies for women that this crisis has made evident. From the care organizations for women in processes of violence, we have been pointing out for long time, with reports and research, with scientific evidence, that primary care services are not prepared to detect and address situations of sexist violence. In all its spheres, this directly affects women's right to a life free of violence and their right to reparation for the harm caused.

In this context, at the XVI Forum against Gender Violence, we focus on life, care, and essential services, where women and the feminist movement are an engine of change.

The pandemic has shown that the economic, capitalist, and patriarchal system, with the motto of "what is sacred is money", seriously harms human and world health. Women, people, are reduced to mere numbers. The economy does not take on account the needs of women and society, but of big business and finance.

We do not want to return to "normality." That of social cuts in health, education, and life resources.

The one that does not provide an equitable distribution of wealth. The one that causes inequalities and leaves sexist aggressors unpunished.

Despite the restrictions on capacity, and of seeing and feeling each other virtually, we will have a space where we can talk, reflect, weave alliances with other social movements. The Forum is a space with a vocation for the exchange of experiences.

We are in a time of change where those in power are looking for ways to take advantage of the crisis to gain more profits and strength in the world market, and on 7.5 billion souls (half of them women). From the bottom up, we must fight for a just, supportive world where violence against women is unthinkable. A world where economic and public resources prevail over private ones, where universal rights are effective.

At the Forum, we will draw conclusions to carry out campaigns and lines of action for advocacy and awareness raising. In the Forum we will expand our network. Together and with the strength of all, we can change, we can transform this patriarchal society that oppresses us.

DENIERS OF SEXIST VIOLENCE: THE FALSE PAS.

Despite recognized bodies such as the WHO or the Spanish General Council of the Judiciary recommending the Parental Alienation Syndrome (PAS) not to be applied because it has no scientific basis, Courts continue to forcibly bind children to abusive parents, and removing custody to supposedly manipulative mothers. The PAS is one of the most serious institutional attacks on mothers trying to protect their children, mainly in cases of gender-based violence and child sexual abuse. At the same time, it violates the fundamental rights of children who are victims of sexual abuse.
